1	make a recovery from	iyileşmek(to get over)►I need to <b>make a recovery from</b> my illness as the final examinations are getting nearer every passing day.
2	take part in	katılmak(participate in)►Jack regularly <b>takes part in</b> competitions.
3	take one's mind off	dikkatini dağıtmak, toparlayamamak(turn one's attention away from)►When I'm ill, reading something or watching a comedy film <b>takes my mind away</b> .
4	play a trick on	oyun yapmak, aldatmak(deceive-often for a joke)►Often people who <b>play a lot of tricks on</b> others don't find jokes so funny when someone makes fun of them.
5	catch a glimpse of	görüvermek, gözüne ilişmek(to see briefly)►The fans managed to <b>catch a glimpse of</b> the pop singer, but they didn't get close enough to get somebody to take their photograph.
6	take advantage of	faydalanmak(benefit from)►You should <b>take advantage of</b> the university's sport centre while you're studying.
7	take pride in	iftihar etmek(to be proud of)►He <b>takes pride in</b> the fact that his son is the mayor of the town.
8	take pleasure in	zevk almak, hoşlanmak(enjoy)►Teachers <b>take pleasure in</b> noticing any distinct improvement in the performance of their students.
9	have an effect on	etkiye sahip olmak(influence)►The opening of the new supermarket will undoubtedly <b>have an effect on</b> the sales of our local shops.
10	keep an eye on	gözü üzerinde olmak, göz kulak olmak(watch, check from time to time)►Nurse, please <b>keep your eyes on</b> Mr. Adam's temperature and if it rises dramatically, let me know.
11	take no notice of	önemsememek, aldırmamak(ignore)►Most of the visitors to the park <b>take no notice of</b> the sign which warn them to keep off the grass.
12	take charge of	sorumluluğu üzerine almak(to become responsible for)►He has had a long acting career, but this is the first time he has <b>taken charge of</b> the whole production.
13	pay a compliment to	iltifat etmek, övmek(give praise to)►The teacher <b>pays compliments to</b> thr students who study hard.
14	make room for	yer yapmak(allow or prepare space for)►This classroom is already over-cowded. How can we <b>make room for</b> another seven students?
15	lose count of	sayısını unutmak(forget how many)►I <b>lost count of</b> the number of times he has tried, and failed, to give up smoking.
16	catch sight of	ansızın görmek(see suddenly or for a short time)►One of the employees in the shop next door to the bank <b>caught sight of</b> the thieves as they made their escape.
17	make sense of	anlamak(understand)►As I couldn't <b>make sense of</b> this sentence, I'll ask the teacher for an explanation.
18	have confidence in	güvenmek(believe in one's ability)►You would <b>have more confidence in</b> expressing yourself in English if you practiced writing compositions in the language more often.
19	set fire to	ateş yakmak(start something burning)►Sometimes the farmers deliberately <b>set fire to</b> their fields after the wheat or corn has been harvested.
20	make contact with	bağlantı kurmak(get in touch with)►After going to America, Ali <b>made contact with</b> a distant relative who helped him settle there.
21	put pressure on	baskı yapmak, zorlamak(urge, force)►Before South Africa abolished apartheid, many countries <b>put pressure on</b> them to do so by not trading with them.
22	have a look at	görmeye zaman ayırmak(take time to see)►The art professor decided to <b>have a look at</b> some original Ottoman paintings while visiting İstanbul.
23	pat attention to	dikkatini vermek(watch and listen carefully)►From my observations, very few travellers <b>pay attention to</b> the safety instructions given at the start of a flight.
24	take care of	bakmak(look after)►We need someone <b>to take care of</b> our son while we are at work.
